

Advent. What is this four-week season of the Church year that gets hidden behind an early celebration of Christmas? The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming" or "arrival". It is a translation of the Greek word Parousia, which originally referred to the Second Coming of Christ. While Christmas is a season of celebration for the gift of Christ, Advent is a season of reflection on our need for the gift. Man became holistically corrupt in the fall into sin, and thus we needed Someone to save us from this corruption, Someone who was not corrupt and could counteract that corruption. Christ was and is perfect, so that He could pay the price of death for us. His holistic and divine perfection counteracts our sin, allowing His death to be the substitute for the death we deserve.

We prepare for the celebration of Christmas by starting the Church year with taking some of the more upbeat hymns and liturgical pieces out of the service for the sake of the Advent reflection. However, this season is different from the somber tone of Lent, it is more quiet than it is somber. Think of it this way, if you go for a walk at night during the winter, even in a busy town or city, the coolness of the air being thicker makes it harder for sound to travel and thus it is quieter. It is easier to have reflection, for you are left with your thoughts and the Spirit guides you to reflect on your need for Christ and the reminder that you have this gift.

With it also becoming darker longer, there is a need for lights. In modern times we have many lights to guide us, some to leisure, some to information needful or not, and some lights to distract us. Lutheranism has brought the tradition of the Advent wreath, in which we light candles to guide us in our quiet preparation for Christmas. A candle is lit each week reminding us of the gifts that we receive in Christ: Peace, Hope, Joy and Love.

May the Spirit guide you in your preparation for the gift of Christ.

Addressing Topical Issues with Biblically Based Answers

God's Word has always been shared most effectively when people openly talk to each other about their hopes, fears, ideas, and struggles. Jesus did, and His people have been striving to do it ever since.

As more people today gravitate to the internet seeking answers to life's most pressing issues, LHM has developed various online platforms around the world that allow staff and volunteers to enter into digital conversations with individuals and provide them with biblically based answers for their lives. **Vivenciar.net** is a bilingual platform that offers relevant content to Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking individuals through downloadable e-books, topical videos, courses, and an opportunity to talk to a team of volunteers throughout Latin America and the United States.

Guadalupe is a young woman who was sad and distressed due to the loneliness she was experiencing. She shared details of her problems with friends, but they began distancing themselves from her for various reasons. She went online for help and discovered Vivenciar.net. She began chatting with one of LHM's volunteers, who calmed Guadalupe down, pointed out the website's content about loneliness, and invited her to download the free e-book on the topic. When Guadalupe asked for prayers, the volunteer explained how finding our best friend in Jesus will help fill the voids in her life. Guadalupe said she appreciated the advice and requested additional materials to learn more about Christ's messages of hope.

María, a 22-year-old student, has been receiving professional treatment for depression for a long time. However, she doesn't feel like it has helped. She began searching online for ways to deal with her depression and came across Vivenciar.net. During her online conversation with the ministry volunteer, she mentioned that she attended church as a child, but no longer does since she feels more "sinful" in that environment. This depresses her even more because she feels like she cannot do what God asks of her. The volunteer conveyed the hopeful message of the Gospel and explained how Maria should focus on the comfort, strength, and peace that only God can provide. While Maria was hesitant to accept a referral to speak with the pastor of the Lutheran church in her town, she agreed to talk with LHM's chaplain pastor through the platform. After several conversations with him, she asked for the Lutheran pastor in her city to contact her. She has started attending services at the church and is participating in a variety of congregational activities as she strengthens her faith.



Enhancement of Deaf Ministry and Outreach Ephphatha Lutheran Mission Society, U.S.

About This Mission Grant

There are an estimated 500,000 deaf users of American Sign Language (ASL) in the United States, 95% of whom are unchurched. There are 124 local or congregational deaf ministries in the LCMS; however, there is a severe shortage of Lutheran resources and interpreters. Ephphatha Lutheran Mission Society (ELMS) is dedicated to serving and supporting the deaf and hard of hearing community with the Gospel.


This grant will help provide interpreters and resources to spread the Gospel message to deaf people in the United States by allowing ELMS to expand its Church Interpreter Training Academy to several satellite locations, potentially training more than 100 new interpreters. It will also allow them to continue ASL translation work of the *Lutheran Service Book* settings 1, 2, 4, and Matins for the benefit of all those who are deaf.

Somali translator and family find safe refuge About 10 months ago, Rev. Joseph's* life changed in a drastic way — perhaps forever —as he was hauled before a local judge in Haiti on vague charges, then ordered to be held without bond.

Next he found himself in one of the worst prisons in Haiti, drastically unlike our American


prisons. Detainees suffer from a severe lack of food and clean drinking water in over-crowded conditions, while temperatures soar into the upper 80s and 90s and vermin scurry about.

There is little hope that Haiti's justice system will free Rev. Joseph any time soon. Since the assassination of President Jovenel Moïse in 2021, the legal system has collapsed in Haiti, and violent gangs rule the streets. Now Rev. Joseph has been transferred to yet another prison where he simply waits.

In the midst of this dark and fearsome situation, the hope of Christ shines.

Like Joseph in Pharaoh's prison, today's Rev. Joseph has remained faithful to God. He is showing leadership, gaining the favor of his guards, and most important of all, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with his fellow inmates.

And the Holy Spirit is working in powerful ways among the lowest of the low in Haiti! Read below a communication from Rev. Joseph to his family:

"Good morning! How are you doing? For my part, God takes good care of me every day. He gives me peace, joy, health and love for others. Today, God

has given me grace. He uses me to preach the Good News of Jesus to the prisoners. 2 Timothy 4:2 - Preach the Word...

"On Sunday mornings, there is a big transformation in the prison. Everyone gets ready to go to church. There are 3 different groups, girls, boys and men. We have already baptized 18 people."

What strength and courage flows into the lost when the Word of God enters their minds and hearts!

To continue and expand this important pastoral work, Rev. Joseph needs the help of his brothers and sisters in Christ.

On July 12, nearly 8 months after he was first imprisoned, he wrote, "The *Small Catechism* is a need [for continuing the instruction of new

MISSION UPDATE:

Somali translator moved to safety, renews outreach

We give thanks that LHF's Somali translator, Rev. Mohamed Gurhan, and



his family have safely settled in their new home in Europe.

Prior to their escape, Rev. Gurhan had established a Lutheran outreach to the people of Somalia, a militantly Muslim country

(Somalia and Ethiopia share a border). As LHF reported in earlier this year, the family was forced to flee from Ethiopia when Muslim leaders threatened them with violence and imprisonment.

Now, he will continue his ministry online and to Somali immigrants in Europe, which has already begun.

"We restarted the Somali prayer and Bible study fellowship last Saturday and distributed some literature, particularly the Somali translation of Koehler's *Light From Above*," writes Rev. Gurhan. "We need to reprint some

of our Somali translated literature, especially 'Jesus Never Fails,' *Good News About Jesus* and *Understanding Christian Faith*, probably a thousand copies of each.

"Also, is there an Arabic translation of 'Jesus Never Fails?' We also need this version."

Please pray that this Somali Gospel outreach will continue to thrive.






Price reduction for Spanish Hymnal orders

believers]...Please, I need your help. Saved to serve, Rev. Joseph."

That's all he requests. Not money, not other luxuries. Just books about Jesus, so he can spread the Gospel and teach.

"For Rev. Joseph [and Haitian Creole-speaking Haiti], there isn't a lot of curriculum produced for teaching the Christian faith," explains Rev. Joseph's sister-in-law. "And if you think about the circumstances for which the catechism was written - for an uneducated population - the situation in Haiti (especially the prisons) is very similar. The catechism is a one-book package that lays out all our teachings systematically. It's a clear, Bible-based way of teaching that's easy to walk through."

LHF has translated and printed the *Small Catechisms* Rev. Joseph needs in the Haitian Creole language. But we need your mission offerings to ship them into Haiti, where Rev. Joseph's family can deliver them to his prison and to other prisons and churches.


