It is important to study history. There are many reasons for this, like not repeating mistakes of the past, discovering the family you were born into, or in the case of Church history learning about the heritage which you were baptized into. For us, the History of God's people goes all the way back to creation, where God made man and the world that we live in. Through our history we learn about the fall into sin, in which God lays down the promise that he would one day send His Son ("enmity", Genesis 3:15) into the world to reunite God with His people. We learn about the Israelites; the people God chose to separate from a world filled with those who had turned against Him. The Israelites, though God's people, were not perfect by any means and constantly rebelled against Him, and the Lord punished them by putting them into captivity, they repented, He rescued them, put them back into the promised land, and the cycle would repeat. This cycle kept occurring until the Lord, at His appointed time, sent Christ into the world to fulfill the promises of Genesis 3:15, and won salvation for us on the cross. Since then, Christ has sent His apostles, and afterwords pastors into the world to proclaim the Gospel to God's people. Over the course of 2000 years there have come false teachers who have separated the church via false teachings. This caused the reformation in the 1500's leading to our expression of the faith in Lutheranism.

In the early 1800's Lutheranism came to America, making its way to Buffalo NY in the late 1830's. For instance, there was an entire Lutheran denomination known as the "Buffalo Synod." The Synod was formed in 1845 but over time, a short time, it saw its churches leave, some to the Wisconsin Synod, some to the LCMS, and the remaining churches in 1930 joined with the American Lutheran Church which is now a part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). In fact, there is a cemetery in Cheektowaga, in which J. A. A. Grabau, the Synod's founder, is buried alongside the other leaders and lay people of the Synod. But the LCMS has a long history in Buffalo. For instance, one of the founding churches of the LCMS is located in Buffalo, that being First Trinity Lutheran Church, the current building being in Tonawanda, but its first building was in downtown Buffalo built in 1840.

There is so much more to our Lutheran History here in Buffalo NY. If you are interested in learning about this rich history, I invite you to come to Bible study on Tuesday, July 9th, at 6PM when my friend, Pastor Matthew Schettler, will instruct us on this History.

Expanding Gospel Proclamation Worldwide

Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO — \$100,000

About This Mission Grant

The LCMS receives frequent requests from other Lutheran church bodies around the world to share theological knowledge and doctrinally sound practices. Supporting and expanding theological education is one of LCMS's key mission priorities to ensure there will be well-educated pastors to lead these congregations.

Very few of these church bodies have the resources to send students to the United States for advanced studies and there is a need for seminary professors who have advanced theological degrees to instruct and mentor pastoral students in their home countries.

God has equipped our seminary professors to fill this gap. International students will come to Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, to complete advanced degrees, and they will return to their country to train pastors who will then shepherd their local churches. This grant will provide aid to international students completing their advanced degrees.



Rev. Aiji Komiyama is a Ph.D. student from Kobe, Japan. A pastor in the West Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church, he earned a Master of Divinity degree from Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary in 2011 and a Master of Sacred Theology degree from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind., in 2020. From 2011-17, he served as pastor for Kita-Suzurandai Lutheran Church (Kita-Suzurandai, Japan). After he earns his Ph.D., he will become a professor at Kobe Lutheran Theological Seminary.



Wondimu Mathewos Game is a Ph.D. student from Hawassa, Ethiopia. He earned a bachelor's degree in theology before coming to Concordia Seminary, where he earned an M.A. in 2021. He has taken part in planting 25 EECMY churches and more than 35 outreach centers/local missions in Ethiopia. "The EECMY is a mission church," he says. "We need the theological foundation that I'm getting here at Concordia Seminary to equip the church for this mission work."



Futao Liu is a Ph.D. student from Kaifeng, China. In 2021, he earned a four-year M.A. in theology from the Cross-cultural Ministry Center at Concordia University, Irvine, Calif. After earning his Ph.D., he hopes to share the Gospel according to Lutheran doctrine in Asia, with a possible focus on evangelizing to those living in Asian countries with significant Mandarin-speaking populations.
