St. Valentine's Day

Yes, yes, I am writing an article on Valentine's Day. Because believe it or not the day is actually a Christian holiday. We often celebrate the day as a day to love one's boyfriend, girlfriend, husband, or wife; although let's be honest the day has turned into spending a lot of money on the girlfriend/wife, and not a day of love for one's significant other.

We as Christians though, are to remember not only love, which I will get into, but we are to remember St. Valentine the martyr. Who was St. Valentine? Well, from what little we know, he was a doctor and a priest in the third century, and he died around 270 AD. He was known for embodying both Christ's care of body and soul, and he cared for his patients and cared for the souls that he was sent to care for. We learn from him to love our neighbors, and he points to Christ who cares for the soul, and God the Father who cares for the body while we are here this side of eternity.

The most we know about St. Valentine comes from his final days and from which we gain some of the Valentine's Day traditions. This is the same truth we proclaim at funerals, that for us who have been baptized and made saints by Christ, will rise from the dead because Christ has defeated death for us.

So, on St. Valentine's Day, let us not only show love to our significant others by way of cards and treats, but by our genuine complete care for them. Let us also remember St. Valentine's confession of the resurrection won for us by Christ's death and resurrection.

February 2025

Did you know? February 2 isn't just Groundhogs Day. It's a church holiday called Candlemas (the church service that went with it had a lot of candles). It's the celebration of when Jesus was presented at 40 days old in the temple and Mary went through purification rites. On that day a man named Simeon saw Jesus and sang the song that we sing/speak after communion in church, which we call the Nunc Dimittis (which means "now let us").

Bible verse of the month: "O Lord of hosts, blessed is the one who trusts in you!" -Psalm 84:12

Catechism: The second commandment and it's explanation

What is the second commandment: You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, sear, use satanic arts, lie or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

Liturgical seasons and colors (look on the altar and pastor) for February: Epiphany- green

Christian symbol of the month: Two Turtle Doves-This symbol goes with The Purification of Mary and Presentation of our Lord or Candlemas. When Mary went through purification rites, she brought two turtle doves. This was the minimum sacrifice. It reminds us of Jesus humility.

Now to praise Him, His redeemed Shall break forth with one accord



Making God's Love Visible Among Families and Youth



LHM—Kazakhstan partners with churches throughout the country to share the Good News of salvation through Jesus Christ with children. Through children's and youth programs, LHM makes God's love visible among families and youth.

Over the summer, numerous children's camps were held at Lutheran churches. The camps hosted between 100 and 300 attendees and included children from the churches as well as others from the neighborhood, providing an opportunity for all to hear about God's love for them.

LHM—Kazakhstan staff took an active part in organizing and planning the activities for each of these camps. At one camp, for children of low-income families, the children had the opportunity to try their hands at carpentry, learn soap making, and take part in other creative activities while also hearing about God's love for them as their Heavenly Father. At the end of the camp, each child was sent home with a package that included toys, sweets, and Christian literature. Parents of the camp attendees received Christian booklets related to raising children.

Preparing a child for school is an important annual activity for families. Unfortunately, for families with many children or those with limited incomes, this time of year is costly. LHM—Kazakhstan staff launched a September project where 550 kits with school supplies were prepared for children in need. In addition to sharing Christ-centered ministry materials, the kits included items like backpacks, notebooks, pens, pencils, rulers, and more that no child can do without to start the school year fully prepared.

Care for Street Children of Western Kenya

Capstone Ministries

About This Mission Grant

Capstone Ministries helps enrich the lives of former street boys and girls who have been reconciled with their families. Capstone Ministries works in Western Kenya, an area where over 800 boys live on the street and survive by begging or stealing. They work to reconcile the boys with God and family.

This grant will provide educational scholarships for day and boarding school as well as vocational training for 52 children. It will also provide 100 Bibles and catechisms, translated into Swahili, for 17 Bible study groups.

Plus, it will support Capstone Camp which focuses on spiritual development, provides group counseling, scouting activities, and mentorship of primary school boys by secondary school boys. They invite 25 to 35 boys to participate in the one-week camp held at a rural university during the school break.



Benard Wadegu (#281) was rescued on 18/02/2014. He had run away from home due to peer influence and was found in the local market. He was invited twice to Capstone youth center at Lutheran Church in Kisumu. He had really worked hard in secondary school and finished with a "B" average and qualified for a government scholarship to university. This is quite remarkable for a former street boy. He is at Masinde Muliro University studying for a BA in information technology.




Jennipher Akinyi (#453) was met on the streets of Kisumu on 3/5/18. She shared that she left home because she feared going to school due to bullying she was undergoing in in school. She was counseled and accepted to be taken back home. The stepmother was called and came for her from the office. The girl sat for KCPE in 2018 where she scored 315 marks and qualified for Boarding school sponsorship. She got admitted at Rae girls Sec School where she is currently a senior in H.S.
