

If you had looked at the piano from late November up through Christmas Day, you would have seen the Magi sitting there. Then they had been moved to the chancel, but they had not yet arrived at the manger scene. This will not happen until Monday January 6^{th,} which is the day of Epiphany. Epiphany is a realization of something that has been revealed. In the church, the season of Epiphany deals with the revelations about Jesus Christ, who He is, what He did, and the benefits and gifts that we receive from Him.

The first thing to remember is the first Epiphany, which we read in Matthew 2: 1-12. First, most translations refer to them as "wise men," If Matthew meant that they were wise, he would have used the Greek word "σοφοὺς" (so-phus, the "phus" as in kung fu(s)) which means wise. Instead, he uses the word "μάγοι" (mag- oi), which means Magi, these were Eastern priests. The reason some have translated them as wise is because in following the Star's guiding, they became wise. In other words they had the Christ revealed to them and became wise to salvation which Christ wins for them and us, but for the sake of translation and the office that they held, they are Magi. They also were not at the Nativity. In fact Matthew 2:11 tells us that the Magi entered the "house" meaning that the young baby Jesus was no longer in the manger. Also, Matthew 2:16 tells us that Herod had order all male babies two years or younger to be killed, leading us to understand that Jesus was around two years old when the Magi showed up.

The point of Epiphany is the revelation of Jesus Christ. The Magi had the eternal King revealed and thus they gave him kingly gifts. They were practical gifts and if nothing else could be sold to help them in their escape from King Herod. Over the course of Epiphany, we will hear and learn many things about Christ. First, we will hear about the Baptism of Christ in which we see Father, Son, and Holy Spirit present at the baptism, just like the Holy Trinity was present at our own baptisms. Second, we learn about Christ's control over creation in being able to turn water into wine at the wedding at Cana. Next, we learn the prophets spoke of Christ, as He reveals in the Words of Isaiah. The following Sunday we will hear about Jesus's authority over the unclean spirits and His ability to heal. We then learn of Jesus being a teacher as He calls His first apostles just as He calls Pastors today. We then learn who we are made to be in Christ and the blessings and woes that come upon the Christian this side of Heaven. We learn in the 7th week of Epiphany to love our enemies just as we would love our friends, after all they are a part of God's creation as we are. We finish Epiphany with the Transfiguration of our Lord Christ, in which the Divinity of Christ is revealed and that the Prophets and the Law point to Him.

There is much to learn during Epiphany, but it is Christ for you at the heart of the season, so let us praise our Christmas Gift as we learn about Him.

Feeding Haitian Children Through Gospel and Meals Trinity HOPE

About This Mission Grant

In Haiti, 4.4 million people suffer from acute hunger; the cycle of poverty is almost never broken. Haitian children attending school have trouble learning with empty stomachs. Trinity HOPE daily feeds and shares the Gospel with children, teachers, and cooks in Christian schools throughout the country.

This grant will be used to feed approximately 538 children, teachers, and cooks each school day for two academic years at Paul et Isabel Lutheran School in Hinche, Haiti.

Children are taught to pray before they eat and when not hungry, are better prepared to participate in classroom activities. They are fed physically and spiritually every day they are in school and become missionaries to their families, bringing them out of the darkness of voodoo, a national religion, and into the light of Jesus.



The children in this photo are the future of Haiti. These students have just a few years left in their education. The Christian education they receive will serve them well and equip them to make a difference in their country. Some may become teachers, others may become nurses, but the most important title they now have is "Redeemed Child of God, through the power of the Holy Spirit." Trinity HOPE believes the key to long-term change in Haiti is Education and the Good News of the Gospel.



Before each meal, children have access to running water to wash hands. This simple task helps to decrease the spread of illnesses and is a requirement of the feeding program. As you can see, running water in Haiti is not the same as it is here. The schools use pitchers of water, drink coolers, or any other make-shift device to ensure the water is flowing and clean.



Notice the girl with the red and white shirt and hair barrettes. She attends a school with a feeding program. Here, in her neighborhood, she stands in front of a typical Haitian home, next to her friends who do not get to go to school. Notice her overall health compared to theirs. They have rust colored hair, small bodies, distended stomachs, and dry skin. These are signs of malnutrition. The meal provided by Trinity HOPE prevents this and strengthens her to learn and share the Gospel.

New Anxiety PDF Adds to Thred's Many Resources

LHM's digital outreach platform, **Thred** at <u>thred.org</u>, continues to build meaningful connections through its menu of FREE content; included are in-depth courses, downloadable resources, topical blogs, a sermon series, and topic-specific PDFs. Thred resources are developed to foster outcomes that empower, equip, and inspire users to engage in meaningful spiritual conversations online and with their peers in real life.

"When you look at Thred content, it will all point to one of these outcomes that we hope the Thred audience will experience. And each of these will hopefully (and prayerfully!) lead Thred followers to be more *EAGER Conversationalists* (lhm.org/eager) in their everyday lives-and as they scroll through their own social media," says Rachel Tichich, LHM's digital development manager.

But sometimes things in life can dampen our desire to communicate and mess with our sense of well-being-things like our anxiety, for instance. Understanding this, Thred seeks to stay in tune with its users' needs and life experiences.

"Thred champions listening first. Thred is always trying to embrace the challenges young people face with integrating faith into their whole lives. We recently worked on a resource to combat the anxiety epidemic that is present in our world. That came from listening to the concerns of the folks who use Thred, says Jon Christopher, LHM videographer and Thred content developer.

Thred's new anxiety PDF, "5 Practices to Help You Manage the Anxious Moments," offers practical tools for managing life's daily stress and anxiety. "The Thred team used a **Project Connect** booklet about anxiety as a launchpad, then adapted it for the Thred audience. Connected to that, there will be an email series about the new resource, which offers additional tips and points readers to more content on the Thred website, says Andréa Vasilo, LHM's content writer.

"5 Practices" gives users five methods to examine their anxieties and suggests ways to understand and work through them. "As the rise in anxiety is a major talking point among the Thred demographic-often related to our constant use of cell phones-this PDF discusses what it means to be a Christian living in the midst of this current cultural moment," Tichich says.

In anxious or settled moments, Jesus offers peace against the chaos and noise of this world.



Make a catch of fish to show what happens when Jesus calls his first disciples.


What you need:


- Cardboard egg carton
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eyes or buttons
- Glue



What you do:

- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- 7. Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.





Answers: Jesus, Simon, afraid, now, fish, people, pulled, boats, shore, everything, followed
